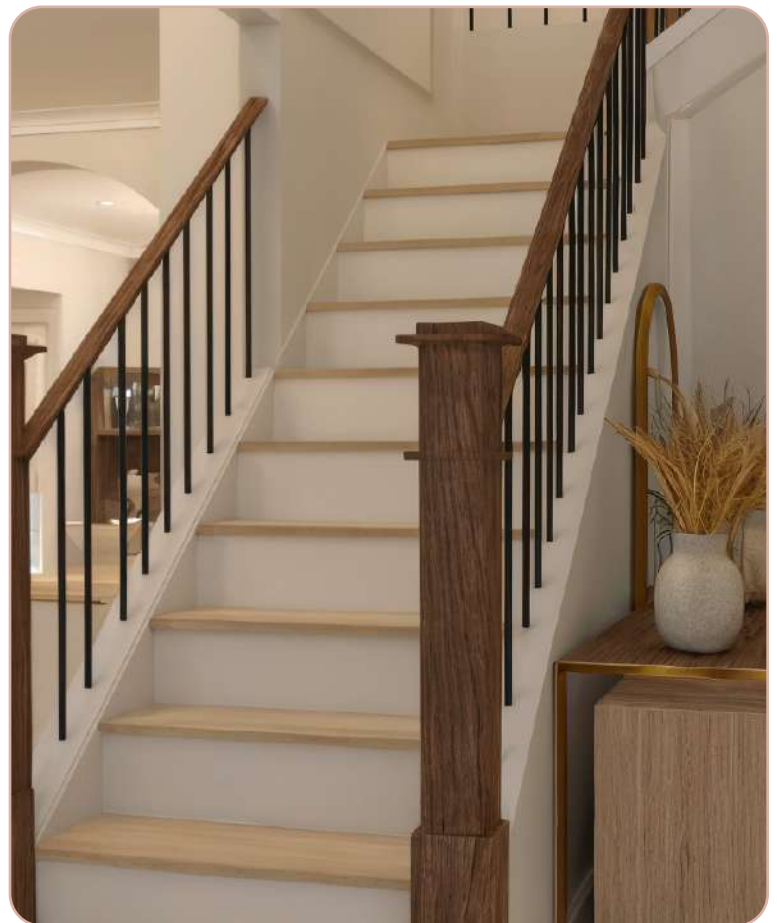
Reducing Stress Through Communication and Planning
